

Sheriff's golf outing aids youth and seniors

Reserve **Tuesday, June 17, 2014** on your calendar for some fun in support of a great cause.

That's the date for the 24th annual golf outing at the Warren Valley Golf Course in Dearborn Heights to benefit the Wayne County Sheriff Youth & Senior Education Fund.

Tee offs are scheduled at 7:30 a.m. and 1:30 p.m. The event also includes lunch and dinner, an auction, prizes and trophies. Cost is \$250 per golfer, \$1,000 for a foursome or \$100 for dinner only.

Since its inception in 1990, the Fund has raised more than \$700,000 to enhance the quality of life for youth and senior citizens through educational and safety programs. The greatest level of giving to the 501 (c) (3) Fund has come under the leadership of Sheriff Benny N. Napoleon, who serves as president of the volunteer board of directors.

The Fund has donated to various organizations that assist youth and seniors, including Ronald McDonald House, COTS, Make a Wish Foundation and Metro Detroit Youth Day. From lunches to summer camps for youth, the Fund provides drug awareness education presentations, first-aid kits, File of Life medical emergency information for seniors and handgun safety (Trigger Lock Program) as well as safety brochures, emergency cell phones and window locks for seniors.

The golf outing is the only fundraiser for the Fund. With no salaries or administrative overhead, virtually all monies are distributed to area programs.
